I. What is Sin?

Definitions:

- 1. "Sin is any want of conformity unto, or transgression of, any law of God given as a rule to the reasonable creature."
- 2. disobedience to the law of God I John 3:4
- 3. My definition for children: "breaking God's rules"

II. Where did Sin come from?

- 1. Satan, in his war against God, attacked God's greatest creation: Man
- 2. Satan tricked Eve into eating the forbidden fruit in Eden Genesis 3:1-7
- 3. Adam at the fruit willingly I Timothy 2:14
- 4. Innocence now lost, man earned a sinful nature that is passed on to all men Romans 5:12
- 5. Every man has this sinful nature Romans 7:17-20

III. Who is a Sinner?

- 1. Every man is a Sinner Romans 3:10, 3:23
- 2. No one is without excuse. We all sin because we are all sinners.
- 3. In regards to salvation, there are no varying degrees of sinfulness. We are either sinners are we are not... and we all are.

IV. What does Sin do?

- 1. Sin is always against God Psalm 51:4, Luke 15:18
- 2. Sin brings guilt and shame Romans 6:19-21
- 3. Sin will destroy you James 1:15
- 4. Sin keeps us from entering Heaven Rev. 20:11-15

V. What is a Christian's response toward sin?

- 1. Recognize it in light of Scripture
- 2. Be troubled to the point of mourning
- 3. Confess it without excuse to God
- 4. Do our best to make up to others our shortcomings
